

CHANGES TO ENTRANCE MARKERS

One of the main topics discussed at this year's Annual Meeting was the condition of the entrance markers. We have also heard from many of you on that issue outside of that meeting. We have heard many good suggestions about how to improve the looks and design of the markers.

We are in the process of exploring changes to the entrance markers. We are looking to replace the entrance signs and enhance the plants and flowers. We have obtained bids from land-scaping companies that include stone or rock signs. The expense for a redesigned entrance marker varies from \$5,000 to \$6,000 per maker. One continuing issue regarding enhancing the plants and flowers is the lack of a water source at the makers. Although homeowners near the markers often volunteer to water the plants and flowers, without a consistent water source or sprinkler system, it is difficult to maintain many types of more colorful plants and flowers. This Board and other past Boards have looked into installing a sprinkler system, but it has been cost prohibitive to install.




ANNUAL FAMILY PICNIC

LOOK OUT NEIGHBOR

Look out for your neighbor!

One of the best parts about living in a stable neighborhood is the neighbors themselves! Unlike apartments or other dwellings where most of the people are moving in and out on a yearly basis, our community is primarily filled with long-term property owners who have a vested interest in keeping the neighborhood as welcoming and safe as possible.
